This phrase is purely hypothetical, and I mean to express no more than a degree of resemblance, supposing marrow and not gristle to have filled the large cavities. The most important characteristics of these fossils so far as determining the genus is concerned, are in the bones of the right foot, which are tolerably well preserved, and a drawing of which--of the natural size, in Plate ix, fig. 6--has been made by my sister, Miss Emily Hitchcock. From this drawing it will be seen that the prominent character of the foot is the robustness of the pollex. Hence Professor...
